If you are a general education teacher with an existing MA in anything other than special education, a special education teacher with a MA in areas other than special education, a school psychologist, a guidance counselor, an occupational therapist, or a speech pathologist, you are faced with teaching or creating behavior plans for students with autism within the general education environment. The SHU certificate will provide you with the tools, strategies, concepts, and assessments that are necessary in dealing with the special needs of students with autism. An SHU certificate in Autism Studies will be awarded to students who successfully complete a five course, 15-credit program. Graduate students may apply the 15 credits earned toward an MA degree at Seton Hall. Graduate students need not be certified teachers to receive the Autism Studies certificate.
