Difficult, challenging behaviors tend to be rooted in trauma and adverse childhood experience. The reactive behaviors that disrupt learning generally stem from poor self-regulation and self-management skills. During this in person inservice, participants will learn practical strategies and a "show, don't tell" approach for helping students develop the social emotional skills necessary for learning and performance.

Participants will gain knowledge and skills in:

1. developing an understanding of why and how traumatic backgrounds lead to survivor behaviors that clash with classroom management and learning strategies for specific target areas;
2. practical strategies to develop classroom practices for safety, stabilization, connection and belonging, and addressing student needs;
3. skills to turnkey to students that help manage anxious, avoidant, aggressive survival style behaviors.
