The most sensitive way to respond to Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) is to embed SEL into the RTI (I&RS) system. Students receive extra help in academic areas to address a lagging skill. Similarly, students who exhibit challenging behaviors often have lagging SEL skills that need to be reinforced. This online inservice of practical solutions provides targeted, evidence-based behavioral supports for students. There will be suggestions for every level of RTI (I&RS) including general classroom practices, level 2 intervention for students who need extra SEL support, and level 3 support for those students who need intensive behavioral support.

Participants will gain knowledge and skills in:

1. learning how the brain and body respond to stress and how to mitigate,
2. building on strengths (healing-informed practice),
3. learning ways to cultivate developmental relationships of healing,
4. identifying emotional triggers,
5. planning for emotional triggers.
