To create a future where everyone walks the talk of equity and social justice, adult SEL cannot be overlooked. This is where SEL begins. Educators who have strong SEL skills can establish positive relationships, model appropriate SEL skills and manage stress and reduce burn-out. CASEL's research is clear: schools are more effective at teaching and reinforcing SEL for students when they also cultivate SEL competencies in adults. This calls on schools to focus on adults' professional growth as educators as well as their own social and emotional learning (Jones et al., 2018). Tangible ways that your school/district can provide supports that help teachers to support themselves as they promote students' SEL competence will be explored during this in person inservice.

Participants will gain knowledge and skills in:

1. defining, exploring and considering Adult SEL (for consistency);
2. sharing strategies that promote what we aim to foster in students;
3. incorporating three ways to integrate Adult SEL into staff meetings and PLCs/department meetings;
4. using and creating opportunities for reflection, conversation and collaboration as you move forward.
