Managing challenging behaviors is one of the keys to smooth classroom operations. The use of effective behavior management in the classroom increases student learning and decreases teacher stress. This in person inservice will provide participants with a framework for understanding challenging behaviors, as well as practical, research supported strategies for prevention and management in the classroom setting. Topics will include understanding the motives of student behavior, the strategic use of positive attention and praise, effective instruction and limit setting, establishing and implementing an individualized score card, and developing class wide behavior programs.

Participants will gain knowledge and skills in:

1. the function of student misbehavior in the classroom,
2. behavioral strategies to prevent or respond to disruptive behavior in the classroom,
3. key components of a successful plan to address disruptive behaviors by a specific student.
